

FORTH & ENDRICK INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS

Draws for all F&E Competitions are made at the first Committee meeting after the AGM.

Only current RCCC members of affiliated clubs within the Province are eligible to compete. Any club member may represent different clubs within the Province competitions during any one season. This member may not transfer at a subsequent stage in the competition nor substitute for another club in that competition.

POINTS

ROBERT PATERSON SHIELD - at Stirling

Each club may submit one team. Each club will play each other club once.

Winner will be decided on points [2,1,0], shots up, total ends.

Exchange of players between RPS and FH League is permitted as follows:-

1. A player who plays Skip/third in RPS cannot play similar positions in the FH League but may play lead/second.
2. A player who plays Skip/third in FH League may play in the RPS in either of these positions once only but cannot then return to the FH League in these positions.
3. A player in the FH League may play at lead/second in the RPS in any game.

FOREST HILLS – at Stirling or Braehead.

Each club may submit one team. Each club will play each other club once.

Final winner will be decided on points, shots up, total ends.

See 1 to 3 above.

FOREST HILLS TROPHY – PROVINCE WEEKEND – at Kinross

Winners will represent F & E Province at the National Province Championships.

Each club may submit 2 teams. Entry is limited to 8 teams. In event of excess entries a draw will eliminate one team from a club entering 2 teams. Games are 8 ends or the bell, whichever comes first.

Unlimited substitutes may be used over the weekend.

A draw will decide order of play in the first round. All teams will play 4 games on a Schenkel system applied after each game.

Winners will be decided on points, ends, shots +/-, total shots. In the event of a tie, an extra end should be played if practicable. Otherwise Skips will nominate one player to draw to the house with normal sweeping. Stones will be measured by an independent umpire.

GORDON MITCHELL ROSE BOWL at Stirling

Failure to appear:

Where one member of a team fails to appear, the game starts on time.

Penalties will be applied as follows –

After 5 minutes – 1 shot

After 10 minutes – 2 shots

After 15 minutes – 2 shots and 1 end 3 ends only to be played

This penalty applies in both sessions. If the team is complete at the start of the second session no penalties will apply in that session.

Each club provides 2 teams to a maximum of 12 clubs. If an odd number of teams enter, the lowest scoring team from last season is eliminated.

The competition is divided into 2 sections each team playing 2 sessions of 4 ends.

The same players must play both sessions in their section.

No substitution of players between teams is permitted.

Winning club is decided by total ends, shots +/- then total shots over the 4 sessions.

PROVINCE MEDAL at Stirling

Same as Gordon Mitchell

JIM CARSWELL CUP KNOCK-OUT at Stirling

Clubs may enter up to 2 teams to a maximum of 16 teams. Unlimited substitutes may be used.

DOUBLE KNOCK-OUT [initiated 01-02 at Forest Hills]

Clubs may enter 2 teams but there will be a maximum of 8 teams accepted. If more than 8 entries are received, clubs entering 2 teams will be reduced to one by ballot in which the holder of the cup will not be eliminated.

PROVINCE POINTS [initiated 03-04] at Braehead.

Clubs are asked to submit names of players to the Province Secretary. All 10 disciplines in the Rule Book will be attempted playing 4 stones at each discipline. [the number of disciplines may be time controlled by the Ice Rink.]

The cup will be won by the Club whose top two players amassed the highest score.

The individual winner will be the curler with the highest score. In the event of a tie, the higher number of 2 point scores will determine the winner. If a winner can still not be determined, a tie will be declared.

AREA 6 COMPETITIONS – NB - Area 6 penalties are higher than those of F & E Province.

AREA 6 BONSPÉL – at Stirling

This competition is played on a Friday evening in January over two sessions. One team from each of 6 clubs represent F&E Province. These are drawn from Clubs applying.

AREA 6 KNOCK-OUT at Stirling

This is played on Friday evenings in November and December. Where a F&E Club has been the previous winner, this Club will automatically be selected along with the top 3 Clubs in the Robert Paterson Shield. Where this does not apply, the top 4 clubs will play.
